

THE IWCV AND THE EU GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (GDPR)

INTRODUCTION

When you join the IWCV you give us some personal information. The EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) places strict controls on what we can and cannot do with this. It also gives you a certain number of rights.

OUR OBLIGATIONS

We may only collect your personal data if we tell you why we need it and how we will use it. We use your personal information for the efficient management of the IWCV.

When you join the IWCV you agree to supply us with the following information:

- Family name and first name
- Email address
- Mobile/landline phone numbers
- Address
- Nationality

This data is managed by the committee of the IWCV. If you have agreed to have your details posted in the list of members, these will be available to other members of the IWCV. You may withdraw from this membership directory at any time following a written request to the Club Secretary. We will cease to hold this information if you should resign from the Club.

Such information should never be made available to commercial organisations, either by the IWCV or by any of its members.

YOUR RIGHTS AND HOW WE MEET THEM

The new legislation gives you the following rights:

The right to be informed about what we do with your information

The right to know what information we hold about you

The right to have any incorrect information corrected and, in certain circumstances, deleted

The right to restrict or object to how we use your information

The right to have a copy of all the information we hold about you.
